

## **Patricia Trost Friedler Scholarship for Young Women**

Established in 2008 by Sallie Bingham, this scholarship is named in memory of her classmate Patricia Trost Friedler.

An outstanding member of the Class of 1954, Patricia overcame the societal challenges of her day to perform at the best of her ability and graduate from Louisville Collegiate School. The scholarship is awarded during the 2010-2011 school year to a young woman who exhibits creative promise, academic achievement and personal qualities of leadership and service.

Interested students will be required to complete a creative essay which demonstrates her art form of choice, submit a letter of recommendation from a current teacher and if selected as a finalist, interview before a selection committee.

Additionally, student applications for the Patricia Trost Friedler Scholarship will be evaluated carefully for past creative accomplishments, academic performance and leadership. The most competitive applicants for the Patricia Trost Friedler Scholarship will have demonstrated her creativity through school involvement or extracurricular activities.

The Scholarship recipient will receive one-fourth the cost of tuition for all four years of Upper School, assuming she continues to be involved in a creative aspect of the school environment, academic performance remains at levels commensurate with ability and past performance and she continues to be involved in the extracurricular life of the Upper School.

In order to be eligible for the Patricia Trost Friedler Scholarship, applicants must be entering the ninth grade. Applications must be submitted to the Admission Office no later than Wednesday, January 20, 2010. *All non-Collegiate students must comply with the normal application process for the school.*

*Based upon an initial review of applicant files, an Admission Committee will determine a group of finalists who will be invited to campus for a formal interview process with the Scholarship Selection Committee.*

**Step 2:** In the space provided on page 3, please write by hand an essay describing how your special talents, past creative accomplishments, leadership capabilities, and school involvement qualify you for the Patricia Trost Friedler Scholarship at Louisville Collegiate School.

**Step 3:** Submit this application to the Admissions Office as directed by **Wednesday, January 20, 2010**. Students, who are not currently enrolled at Louisville Collegiate School, will be asked to follow the standard admission process, and complete an application packet, which requires a letter of recommendation from a current teacher and complete the admission testing which will take place on **Saturday, January 9 or Saturday, January 23, 2010**.

Current Collegiate students will not need to take the standardized test, submit an admission packet or a letter of recommendation as a formal review with current 8th grade faculty will occur following their application.



### **Patricia Trost Friedler Scholarship for Young Women**

- Annual, renewable stipend equal to one half the Upper School tuition, subject to:
  - the winner continuing her involvement in a creative aspect of the school environment;
  - academic performance remains at levels commensurate with ability and past performance;
  - and she continues to be involved in the extracurricular life of the Upper School.
- The most competitive applicant for the Patricia Trost Friedler Scholarship will have demonstrated her creativity through school involvement or extracurricular activities. A candidate's level of creative promise, academic achievement, and personal qualities of leadership and service will all be considered.

### **Procedures:**

- Return a completed application by **Wednesday, January 20, 2010**.
- Finalists will be announced during the week of **February 8, 2010**.
- Finalists will return to Louisville Collegiate School for a personal interview with the Selection Committee on **Thursday, February 25, 2010** and may be asked to bring an example of their creative art form.
- Recipients will be announced on **Wednesday, March 3, 2010**.
- Contracts due from Recipients on **Monday, March 8, 2010**.
