

# Martin Family Ensures Legacy at Collegiate

In 2007, **Judge Boyce F. Martin, Jr., W. Grier Martin** and **Barbara Martin Dudley '57** established the Martin Family Scholarship to honor their father, **Boyce F. Martin, Sr.** Judge Martin's daughters Julie and Mavin also contributed to the fund.

Boyce F. Martin, Sr. served as a member of the school's Board of Trustees from 1949-1975 and as President of the Board from 1965-1973. The scholarship also honors the legacy of the Martin family at Collegiate which includes four graduates: **Mavin Brown Martin '56, Barbara Martin Dudley '57, Anne Brewer Ogden '64** and **Elizabeth Leigh Martin '89**. Other family including **Mavin H. Martin '80A** and **Julia Martin Hudson '81A** attended Collegiate and **Sophie Johnson, Mavin's daughter, will graduate in 2014.**

Funds from this scholarship are used to enrich the Collegiate student body by offering financial assistance to students of diverse economic backgrounds, as well as diverse cultural and ethnic backgrounds. The school provides over \$1.7 million in financial assistance and merit scholarships annually.

During the past year Barbara and her husband Lee decided to join the Speed Society by including Collegiate in their estate plans and contributing to the Martin Family Scholarship fund.



As she reflects on the years she spent at Louisville Collegiate School, Barbara recalls, "I can remember some of my classes with Mrs. Cropper (Latin), Miss Wittmeier (Problems of American Democracy) and Mrs. Bier (History of Art) who challenged and inspired me to do my best. When I returned to college after working for some years, I felt comfortable knowing that I had been taught how to study and learn at Collegiate."
